1. Confirmation of Minutes of CLANT AGM 19 November 2014

2. Acceptance of Financial Report 2014/2015

Treasurer Nicola MacCarron reported an overall loss of about \$13,000 in 2014/15, which was normal in a "non-conference year", due to donations and expenses.

CLANT's current bank balance is \$201,286.25.

3. Committee Report

Russell Goldflam acknowledged the work of the 2015 committee. Retiring members, particularly the Secretaries, thanked for their service. CLANT has continued to play an active role contributing to public debate on various policy issues.

The 2015 conference was difficult because of controversy over whether to hold it in Bali again in the context of the executions of Andrew Chan and Myuran Sukumaran. After much discussion and consultation with members, the CLANT committee unanimously decided to keep the conference in Bali. The forced change of venue (due to the closure of the Bali Hyatt for renovations) was also challenging. Attendance was down, but the conference was successful and generated a \$37,000 profit to CLANT.

In addition to having served as Principal Legal Officer of CAALAS, a Magistrate, Director of NTLAC, CEO of the Department of Justice, the DPP, and a CLANT Committee member over many years, Richard had presented papers at CLANT conferences, including two of particular importance, on: (1) mandatory sentencing for murder, delivered jointly with Rex Wild QC (2001), which paved the way for the 2005 murder sentencing reforms; and (2) the escalating indigenous prison population in the NT (2011).
